Not recognising the photo, but knowing that Kirkbride was built on similar lines to Dalmalin Lodge, Isabel McLeod suggested that we try Kirkbride farmhouse.



The leaded panes in the window above the door and also the pane in the porch window pretty much conclude that this is the same building

Before going to Kirkbride we looked at the Anwoth census for 1911.

The parents and 4 children must be the family in the McMurray photo. The children in the photo appear to be about 3 years older than in the census, so the picture would have been taken in about 1914.

The young child above (Carolynne Welles) was the daughter of Marion Welles (née Connell). Marion Connell was evacuated as a teenager from Glasgow during WWII and stayed with the McCreadie family at Kirkbride. She came back to visit the McCreadie family several times after the war.

Bobby & Sam Davidson were probably related to the McCreadie family and were either regular visitors or workers at Kirkbride.

Cousins James W and Margaret Davidson (themselves grandchildren of "Carrick fisherman" William Davidson) married McCreadie siblings Margaret and Samuel (children from the above family per 1911 census).
