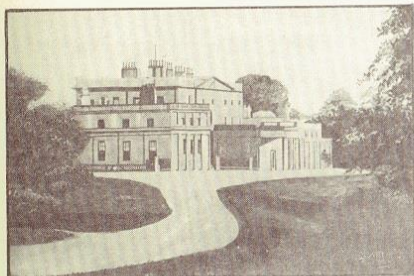

Won Military Maiden Steeplechase, Newbury, 2 miles. Carried 11st. 3lb., and won by 6 lengths ..	£88
Won West of Scotland Steeplechase, Eglinton, 2½ miles. 5 ran. Won by 6 lengths	£164
Won Gt. Staffordshire Steeplechase, Wolverhampton, 2½ miles. Carried 10st. 10lb. and won by 3 lengths. 5 ran	£338

FIVE YEARS OLD (1913).

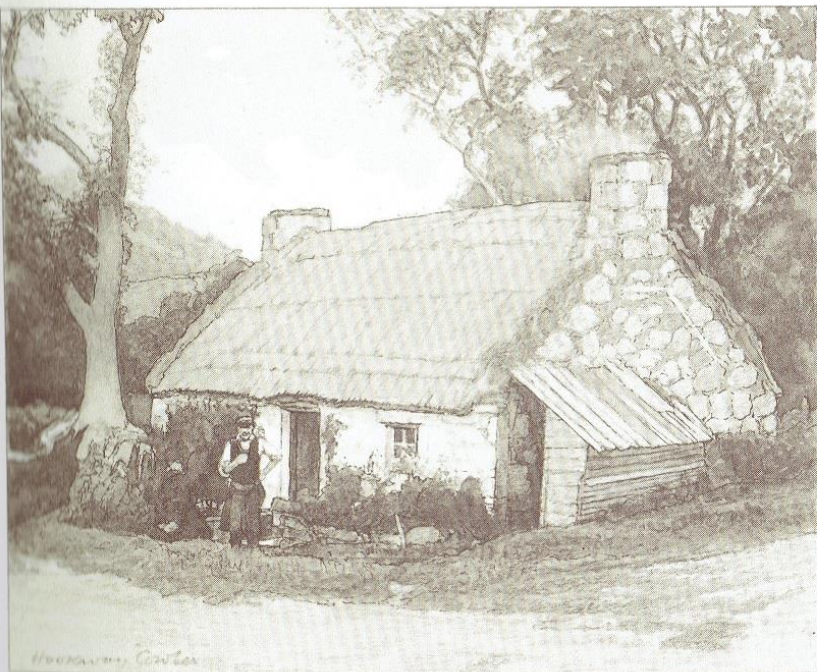
Won Middlesex Handicap Steeplechase, Kempton Park, 2 miles. Carried 11st. 1lb. Won by a head, 6 lengths between 2nd and 3rd	£97
Won West of Scotland Handicap Steeplechase, Eglinton, 2½ miles. Carried 11st. 12lb., and won by ¾ length. 5 ran.	£136
Won Busbridge Handicap Steeplechase, Sandown Park, 2 miles. Carried 11st. 11lb., and won by 2 lengths, giving 12lbs. 16 ran	£92
Won Andover Handicap Steeplechase, Newbury, 2 miles. Carried 11st. 13lb. and won by a length. 13 ran ..	£88

SIX YEARS OLD (1914).

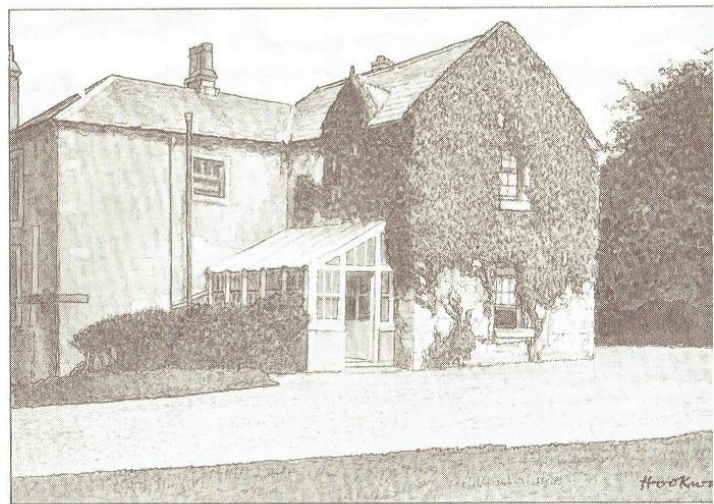
Won Stayers Steeplechase, Birmingham, 3 miles. Carried 11st. and won by a head from Rory O'Moore. 5 ran	£77
Won Grand National Trial Steeplechase, Newbury, 3¼ miles. Carried 11st. 6lb. and won by 6 lengths, beating Couvrefeu II., Ballyhackle, Celerity, &c. 9 ran	£177
Won Champion Steeplechase, Liverpool, 2 miles 7½ furlongs. Carried 12st. 2lb. (top weight). 6 ran ..	£862
Won Members' N.H. Flat Race, Ludlow, 2 miles. Carried 11st. 5lb. 3 ran	£97
Won Newark Handicap Steeplechase, Nottingham, 2 miles. Carried 12st. 7lb. (top weight), and won by a length, 10 lengths 2nd and 3rd, beating Ally Sloper (receiving 13lb.), King of the Scarlets (receiving 15lb.), &c. 8 ran	£68
Won Coleshill Steeplechase, Birmingham, 3 miles. Carried 12st. (top weight), and won by ¾ length from Father Confessor, to whom he was giving 28lb. Eight lengths between 2nd and 3rd. 7 ran ..	£77
Won Wigan Steeplechase, Haydock Park, 3 miles. Carried 11st. 7lb. (top weight), and won by 1½ lengths. 5 ran	£68
2nd (to Rory O'Moore) in Liverpool Trial Steeplechase, Sandown Park, 3½ miles. Beaten half a length with a bad third. 6 ran.	

SEVEN YEARS OLD (1915).

3rd with 12st. 7lb. in Manchester Steeplechase. 3 miles, giving 10lb. to Irish Mail and 25lb. to Blow Pipe. 2nd, with top weight, 12st. 7lb. in Broughton Steeplechase, Manchester, 3 miles, giving 13lb. to Celerity and beaten ¾ length. 3rd, with top weight, 12st. 4lb. in Grand National Trial Steeplechase, Sandown Park, 3¼ miles, giving 21lb. to Usury, and 13lb. to Couvrefeu II., and beating Ally Sloper to whom Ilston was conceding 13lb. 3rd (with 11st. 12lb.) in Champion Steeplechase, £437, Liverpool, 2 miles 7½ furlongs.
