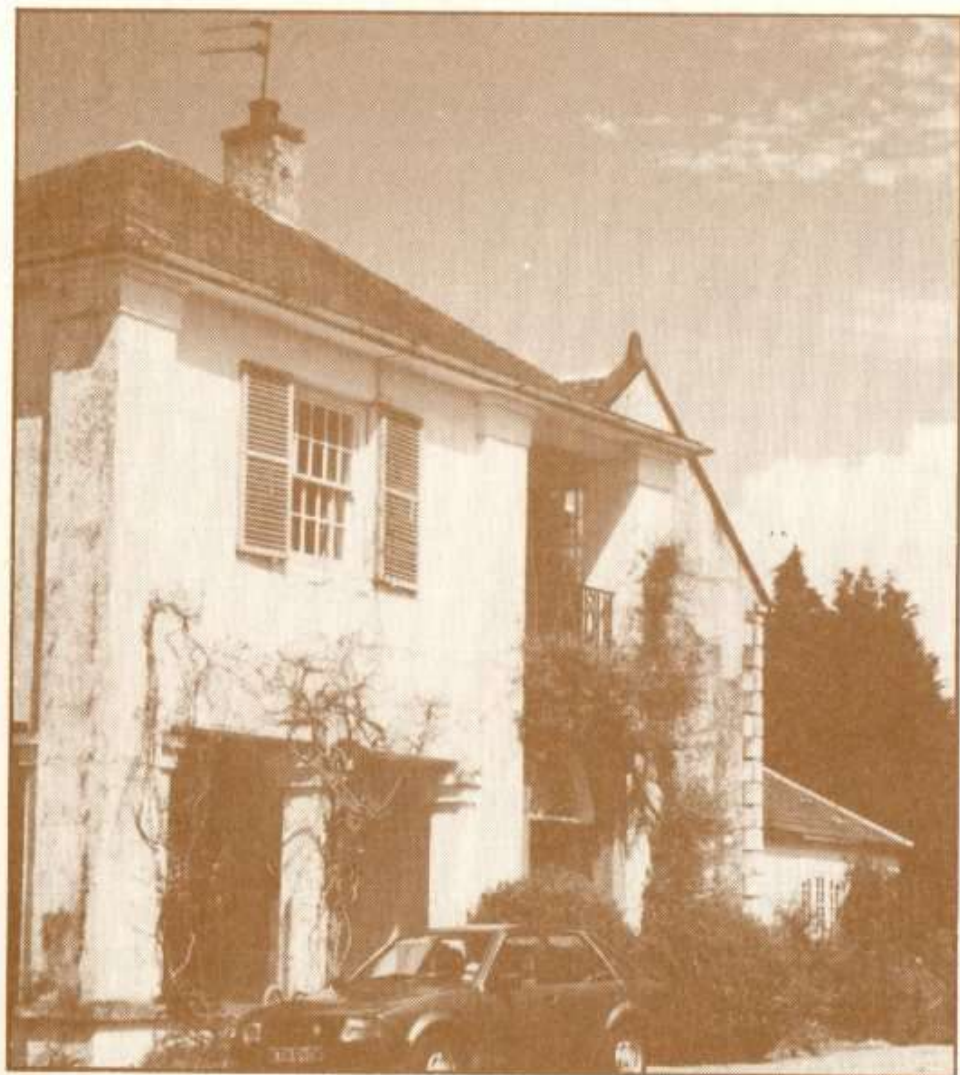

MR MURRAY STEWART, OF CALLY,

ANWOTH AND GIRTHON TENANTRY.

A letter, purporting to be written by a Cally Tenant Farmer and dated 1890, and signed "A Lover of Truth," appeared in the Glasgow Herald of 18th March last, reflecting upon the character of Mr Murray Stewart as a landlord. Its contents were simply a tissue of falsehoods—a gross and unscrupulous libel upon the kindly relations which exist between the popular and universally respected Laird of Cally and his Tenantry. The following Address, signed by all the Tenant Farmers on the Cally Estate in Anwoth and Girthon, and by all the Rookie Ricks (which pass into Mr Murray Stewart's possession only a few months ago, except the Tenants of Pollock and Rookie House, was presented to Mr Murray Stewart on the 24th inst. The Tenants of Pollock—Messrs J. & T. Gairdner—were not present at Captain Hume's Meeting referred to in the said letter, and distinctly state that they know nothing whatever about the letter until they see it in the Standard. It will thus be seen that in Cally or Rookie Tenant Farmer wrote the letter. The Cally and Rookie Tenant Farmers have then signed the bottom of the libel that was sent upon them by an anonymous correspondence writer, so spiteful and unscrupulous a fellow as the Standard. The following is the Address which I received—
