1, 3 & 5 Fleet Street - Ship Inn / Anwoth Hotel





This building has the appearance that it has always been a hotel, but it is not until the 1851 census that the occupier is referred to as an inn-keeper. It was initially called The Ship Inn as it is today, but for a time between about 1925 and 2005 it was known as The Anwoth Hotel. For some of its early years, at least the ground floor of no.5, was used as a butchers shop.

William L Walker, innkeeper, owned 3 properties in Fleet Street: (209) a house occupied by William Bell, butcher, (210) a house occupied by Margaret Archer, spinster, and (211) a house and offices (*The Ship Inn*) which he occupied himself.

In the 1901 Census William Bell is living at Bridge Terrace (across the road from the Ship Inn), whilst Margaret Archer was not living in Anwoth.

Ship Inn sold by William Lamont Walker, formerly restaurant manager, Edinburgh to Joseph Dignam, bar 1908 manager, 198 Keppochhill Road, Glasgow.

Joseph Dignam, innkeeper, owned and occupied the house and offices known as The Ship Inn. He also owned a house in Fleet Street where Thomas Dunning, grocer, lived. He also owned a shop in Fleet Street where the registered tenant was D Hill Jack & Son, 141 West George Street, Glasgow.

1930-31 Anwoth Valuation Roll:

Joseph Dignam, innkeeper, owned and occupied **The Anwoth Hotel** and a garage. He also owned a house and shop in Fleet Street where John Adams was tenant. It is possible that this was at least part of no.5 Fleet Street which we believe was used as a butcher's shop for some time.

He also owned a house in Fleetside Terrace – which may have been Bridge Terrace.

1935 Sold by trustees for creditors of late Joseph Augustus Dignam to Hugh Robert Murchie, Girvan.

Hugh Robert Murchie sold The Anwoth Hotel to John Wright Pinkerton. 1939 [Hugh Murchie bought **The Murray Arms** from Adelaide Payne in 1939]
