Charles Watt drowned in the Skyreburn river in 1863, after which his sister Janet inherited 17 Fleet Street. She probably lived there until she died, unmarried in 1867.

After the death of Janet Watt, her nephew George Darling Watt (son of her oldest brother James) inherited 17

Fleet Street. George had been the 1st convert to Mormonism to be baptised in the British Isles. He was born in Manchester in 1812 and had emigrated to Utah in about 1850.
