



The Burns events are all detailed in a seperate programme available from Tourist Information Centres. Gatehouse of Fleet's contribution to the Burns year is a new tableau and audio visual facility in Mill on the Fleet visitor centre.

Noky and I wish everyone a happy summer in Gatehouse of Fleet no matter whether you live here or are just visiting. Our thanks also to the local traders who support the Gala Association so well and make this publication possible and finally a big thankyou to the dedicated committee members who have given so much time all winter attending meetings.





Fleet Oakwoods Forest Trails

The three trails lead you through part of 263 hectares of Forest Enterprise land, formerly belonging to the Cally Estate, which was renowned for its fine broadleaved trees.

The Forestry Commission acquired the land in 1933 and since then has continued the tradition of planting broadleaved species on these fertile soils. Nearly all the trees you will see are between 50 and 60 years of age and are only half-way to being mature trees. This particular section of the forest provides a vivid contrast to the large conifer plantations of the Southern Uplands, where the peaty soils tend to favour the growth of spruces and pines.

To assist you with the tree species identification as you walk round, occasional trees and shrubs have been 'name-tagged'.

With careful observation and a modicum of luck, you will be fortunate enough to see a wide variety of flora and fauna.



Likely floral sitings are wild iris, primroses, wood anemones, wood sorrel, bramble, celandine, stitchwort, snowdrop, bluebells and campion.

You will encounter a myriad of insects including many butterfly and moth species.

Animal species within the forest area include roe deer, red squirrels, hedgehogs, voles, rabbits, hares and foxes.

Bird species are also prolific and special mention must be made of buzzard, pheasant, woodpecker, tree creeper, warblers, finches and tit species.

GATEHOUSE GOLF CLUB

This 9-hole course is situated on the Laurieston Road, within walking distance of Gatehouse.

Imaginatively laid out in 1921, the course is a good test of a players golfing skills all the year round. Whilst the good golfers enjoy the challenge the course presents, it is also the type of course that can be played and enjoyed by any standard of golfer, including beginners and juniors.

From the clubhouse, and playing the first hole, impressions are of a very hilly course, but visitors should not be put off, as the next seven holes are more on a level, before playing the dramatic short 9th hole back to the clubhouse. The views alone are worth the visit, as in one direction beautiful hills and glens can be seen, whilst in the other the view over Gatehouse itself to Wigtown Bay and the Isle of Man is rather special.

Visitors are made most welcome, and the club attracts golfers from all parts of the United Kingdom as well as overseas. Most people having played the course once, cannot wait to arrange a return visit, such is the enjoyment and pleasure a game of golf at Gatehouse can give you. The Green Fees for the 1996 season are £10 per day (including weekends) for adults and £5 for juniors. There is no limit on how many holes you play in the day, so with the long summer days, plenty of golf can be played. The course is reserved most Sunday mornings until approximately 12 noon for Club competitions for members, but apart from that time, visitors are very welcome. (Full details of any special tee reservations i.e. party bookings etc., can be seen on the notice board at the club car park).






The theme then widens to include the whole of Galloway, and visitors can enjoy a 'magical mystery tour' through the medium of the audio-visual production on the first floor. Other exhibits can be seen, including the 'Wee Toon,' a model of Gatehouse as it was c. 1800, before returning to the ground floor to browse through the shop, or to enjoy the home-baking in the tea-room.
