

Taking over the garden of the acclaimed plant hunter Michael Wickenden would be daunting to anyone, however, the support from the local community has been a great asset and I have been made so welcome in our small but wonderful town.

With the help of local volunteers we have been able to get on with getting the gardens back in shape and along the way I have made some firm friends. Every day I discover another of Michael's botanical treasures, usually hidden behind another plant or in an unexpected corner of the 3 hectare site.

The Fleet Valley volunteers have been amazing as we work to start to remove thee invasive Rhododendron ponticum from the woods, and with the Gatehouse Squirrel Group we are now working to construct a wildlife viewing hide above the gardens.

Back to the gardens, we are receiving fantastic feedback from visitors old and new; every day the gardens change and the new additions of a large collection of Magnolias and a stunning new bed of Slipper Orchids are creating a lot of interest and drawing visitors from far and wide.
