
I hope you all have the most amazing gala week filled with fun, laughter and of course good weather, and I very much look forward to seeing you at some point over the course of the eight days!

Road Closures:

During the course of Gala Week, we are able—having received permission from both D&G Council and the police to do so— to close sections of the town's public roads to all vehicles, in order that we may hold specific gala events and, obviously, to ensure public safety.

We ask you to please note and respect these closures and make alternative arrangements if you would normally need access by car during these times. We have kept such closures to a minimum, and we ask for your support with this.

Roads will be closed to vehicle access on these dates and times:

Tuesday 30th July: 18:30 – 21:00 Fun Run route: Garden Street, B796, U13s, U24s, C13s, Laurieston Road, High Street, Garden Street.

Wednesday 31st July: 21:30 to 22:15 Torchlight Procession route: Garden Street, B796, High Street, Ann Street.

Saturday 3rd August: 12:15 to 13:30: Gala Day Parade route: Garden Street, B796, High Street, Ann Street.

Some Gala venues in Gatehouse of Fleet 2024

Our Gala is one of the highlights of our community's year. It is an opportunity for both locals and visitors to participate in a variety of events and activities and to enjoy the lovely surroundings with which we are blessed.

We particularly hope that the Gala is an opportunity in which visitors can feel welcome and, in particular, welcome to participate.

For those not familiar with the local area, the following descriptions of key venues and locations may help:

Garries Park is located behind the houses on the south side of the High Street (the car park side). There are three entrances to the park from the High Street; through the main car park, via the top of Ann Street, turning sharp right at the bowling green; or through the arch mid-way up the High Street (directly opposite Digby Street).

The Community Centre is located in Dromore Road, about 150 metres beyond (north from) the Ship Inn;

The Tennis court is about 200 metres along the (Laurieston) road north from the war memorial;

Entrance to the **golf course** is adjacent to the tennis court, as above;

The Cally Gardens are located approximately a half-mile down Cally Drive which is itself entered through the stone driveway entrance posts to the east of the town (beyond the war memorial). Turn first right as you climb the hill out of the town and enter the long, straight Drive.

The Mill on the Fleet, as the name suggests, is adjacent to the river, between it and (behind) the High Street. Access to the Mill is clearly displayed directly opposite the main car park entrance.

The small circular Car Park Shelter, as its name suggests, is located in the main car park close to Spar and adjacent to the pavement.

Wheels of Fleet is located directly opposite the entrance to the Mill on the Fleet building.

Torchlight Safety

It goes without saying that we hope our gala week as a whole is an enjoyable—and safe—time for all concerned. That particularly applies to the use of the torches during the procession from the Community Centre in Dromore Road, along the High Street and then Ann Street and into Garries Park on **Wednesday evening**, **31st July**.

Burning torches can be dangerous and so we ask you to please observe the following in the interests of safety:

- It is not advisable to bring pets (both the torches and the subsequent firework display will cause them considerable distress),
- Please wait at the starting point for your torch to be lit by one
 of the 'designated torch lighters' (i.e. please do not light each
 other's torch as accidents can easily happen particularly in such
 a crowded space),
- Please do NOT join the parade at any point other than the start,
- When in the parade, do not hold your torch near anyone else, even in fun,
- Do not point your torch to the ground, because if you do, the flame will rise up the torch body and there is a risk of seriousburns to your hand (and the torch will have a shorter life),
- Supervise children at all times,
- If there is any danger of fire risk at any time during the parade, large water buckets are located at regular intervals along the route and must be used if needed to extinguish your torch, and
- At the end of the parade in Garries park, please dispose of your torch on the bonfire as soon as you reach it.

Please take great care—AT ALL TIMES—and enjoy your evening!




