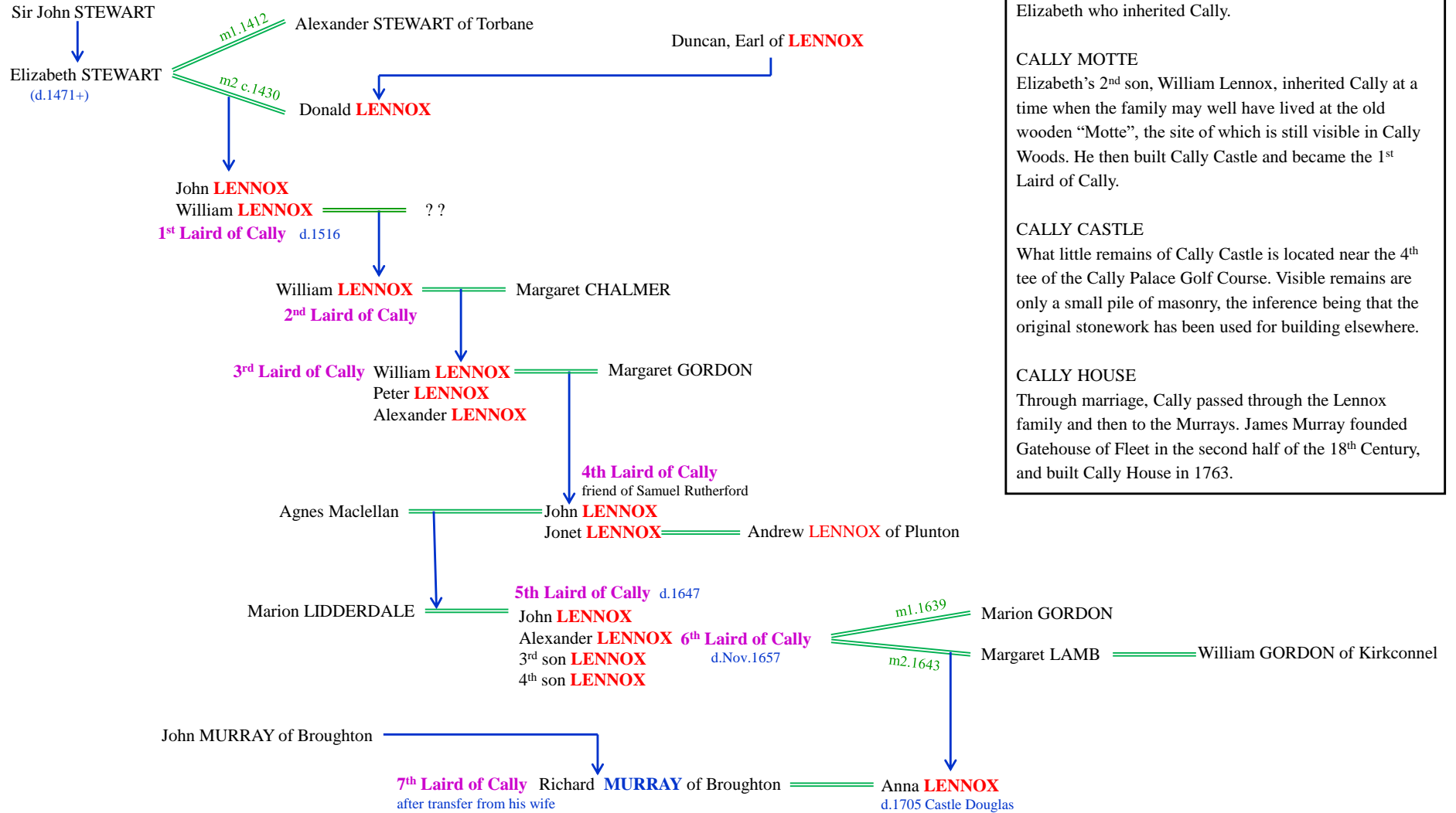


Lairds of Cally (1)

William Lennox to Richard Murray



At the beginning of the 15th Century, the Cally Estates were owned by Sir John Stewart. We know little about him except that he died on 2nd February in 1418 or 1419. We do not know his wife's name, but he had a daughter named Elizabeth who inherited Cally.

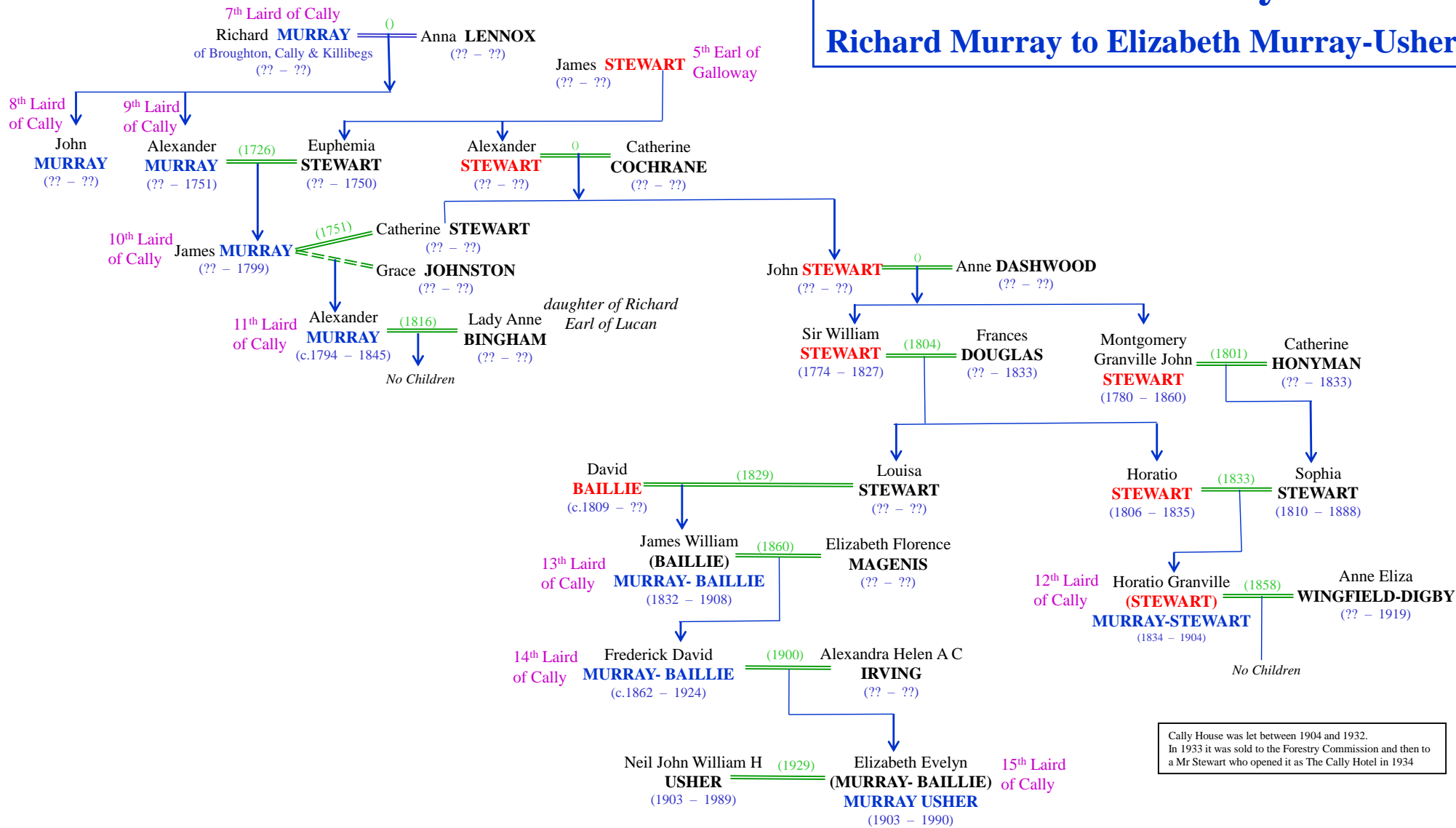
CALLY MOTTE
Elizabeth's 2nd son, William Lennox, inherited Cally at a time when the family may well have lived at the old wooden "Motte", the site of which is still visible in Cally Woods. He then built Cally Castle and became the 1st Laird of Cally.

CALLY CASTLE
What little remains of Cally Castle is located near the 4th tee of the Cally Palace Golf Course. Visible remains are only a small pile of masonry, the inference being that the original stonework has been used for building elsewhere.

CALLY HOUSE
Through marriage, Cally passed through the Lennox family and then to the Murrays. James Murray founded Gatehouse of Fleet in the second half of the 18th Century, and built Cally House in 1763.

Cally House was let between 1904 and 1932.
In 1933 it was sold to the Forestry Commission and then to a Mr Stewart who opened it as The Cally Hotel in 1934
