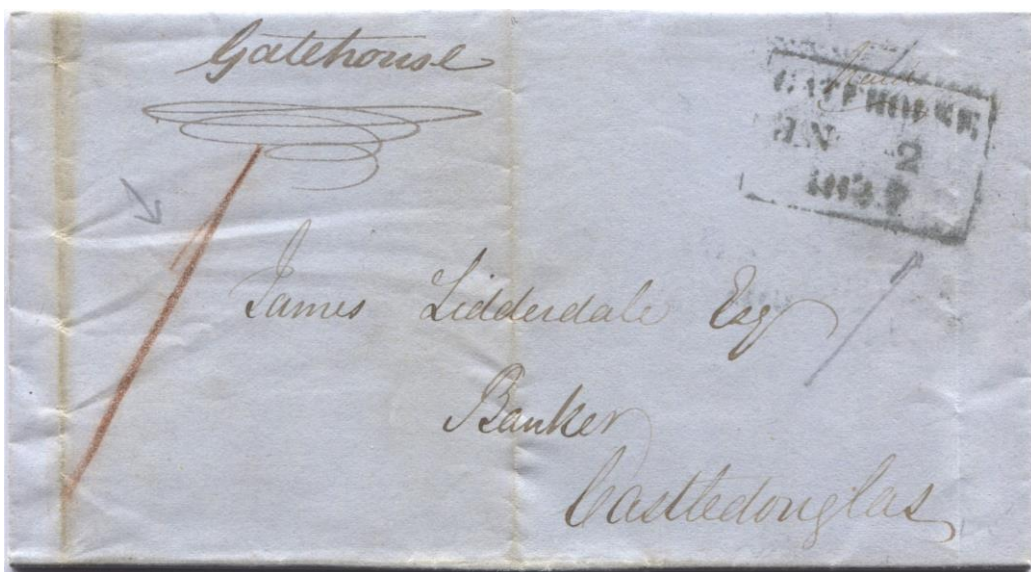

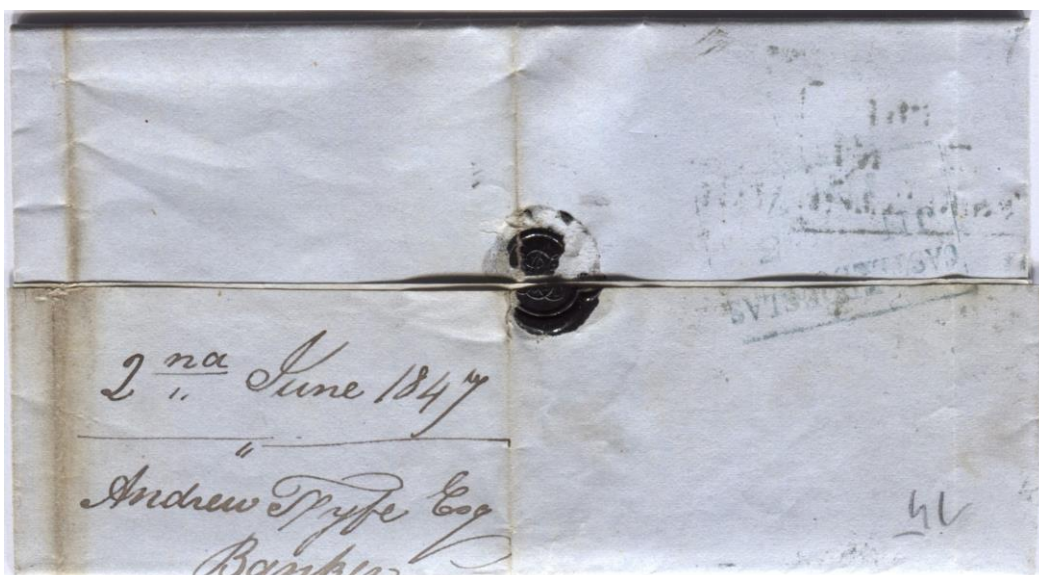
Postal charge 1d.

No adhesive stamp after being in use for 7 years

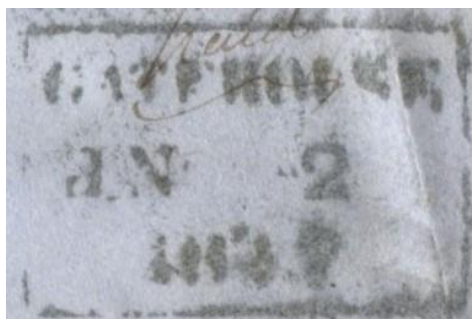
front

Letter

Cathouse 2^d June 1847.

Dear Sir,

Referring to your Letter of the 29th and our Conversation on Monday, I am sorry that you have received such strict orders with regard to Mr W^m Kirkpatrick's Bill to Mr Notman, and which was paid in full by him, in terms of the Receipt I sent you.

I have now to intimate that upon the 22nd ulto. Mr William Kirkpatrick executed a Trust Deed in my favor, for behoof of himself and his Creditors, in order that I might wind up his affairs and pay off his debts &c. This of course, I will lose no time in doing, and as I am satisfied there will be ample funds to meet all demands and leave a Reversion, I will take it kind if you will intimate this to the Head Office, in order that no expenses that can be avoided may be incurred.

I have communicated the execution of this Trust Deed to all the other Creditors, and have requested their Accession. I trust your Bank will do the same, if Mr Notman has not yet paid the balance, which I hope he has.
