


Erected by Will<sup>m</sup> Kie, Mason in Gatehouse in memory of his son John who died 24<sup>th</sup> Jan<sup>y</sup> 1826 aged 20 months. And Helen his daughter who died 26<sup>th</sup> July 1826, aged 3 years. Also James his son who died Aug 4<sup>th</sup> 1836 aged 4 months. Also William his son who met with death by drowning, while amusing himself with his schoolfellows on the ice on the Long Lochboreland Hill 18 Dec<sup>r</sup> 1841 aged 11 years. William Kie the erector whose body is interred in Iona, died at Ardfinaig 18<sup>th</sup> June 1848 aged 58 years. Agness McKie his wife died at Gatehouse 7 Jan 1867 aged 70 years.

<u>Reverse</u> - Also Mary Kie who died in Garlieston 7 August 1840 aged 19 years. David his son aged 22 years, who lost his life swimming ashore from the wreck of the 'Royal Charter' 26 Oct 1859, his body lies in Moelfra Churchyard, Wales. John his son who died in London 7 Dec 1859 aged 32 years.
