
3 & 5 High Street - Fergusson's Drapers

No.3 is a private residence; No.5 was a drapers shop

In 1877 this property was purchased by John Fergusson, who opened a drapers shop on the ground floor of No.5. The property is still owned by his grandson's widow (as of 2015).

- 1767 Part of John Walker, weaver's feu (which also included the bank building).
- 1784 John Walker sold to William Hannay of Bargally

1825-26 Pigot & Co. Directory

Nelson Rae was a surgeon whose practise was in High Street.

He owned 3-5 High Street from 1803 and also 27-29 High Street from 1811. He was not living in either property in 1841 and we have no information as to which, if any, might have been his practice address and which was his home.

1837-38 Pigot & Co. Directory

Catherine McGeoch & Sisters ran a Milliners & Dressmakers business in Front Street.

1852 Slater's Directory: There are 2 entries for the business run by Catherine McGeoch of High Street –

(1) Linen & Woollen Draper & (2) Milliner & Dressmaker

1857 Dr Fehrzen, from South Africa, son-in-law and heir of Nelson Rae granted Marion Brown sister of John Brown life rent.

1859 Valuation Roll: John Brown (late factor) was proprietor and occupier. (N.B. 'late' must have referred to that fact that he was no longer a factor, rather than that he was deceased).

John Fergusson, draper in Gatehouse bought the property from Thomas McGuffog, Esquire, cotton spinner in 1877 Preston. The property has continued in the Fergusson family into the 21st century.
