Hugh Slimmon was a grocer & spirit dealer in High Street. 1851 census shows Alexander Slimmon living just round the corner in Cross Street, now Digby Street. It is likely that Thomas Campbell & Hugh Slimmon were business partners.

Hare is a picture which conjures up memories of days gone by when ice cream cornets, were a hapenny a time and a bottle of ginger beer cost a penny. The attractively decorated cart in the picture belonged to the late Giulio "Johnale" Fruitant, of Gatehuse, who is seen with his two childrens and an doubt it will still be remembered by the alder generation in the town.
