## 77 High Street - Laurelbank

The Brewery Buildings existed from about 1769. They were inherited by John McWilliam in 1834 and he bought, from Alexander Murray, land around the brewery in the same year. He was granted a feu in 1836, probably for the construction of Laurelbank, which was sold in 1847 to William Ramage. Ownership was divided in 1864 by the sale of no.77.

We believe that the Broadfoots lived at no.79 and the Helmes lived at no.77.

Another was owned by Sir William Maxwell of Cardoness + William Francis Maxwell and it was occupied by Thomas & William Helme. These are the same owners and occupiers as in 1878. The 3<sup>rd</sup> house & garden was owned by John McClellan of Australia, and it was occupied by Alexander McClellan, gamedealer. We believe that, in the census return, the 3<sup>rd</sup> property has "ditto" marks in the wrong place and that the property referred to was in fact 69 High Street.
