William Hume, joiner (1834-1910) married Eleanor James, daughter of John James, the Principal Customs Officer in Gatehouse, on 22 March 1872 in the Parish Church of Anwoth. They had 13 children. In 1881 & 1891 William & Eleanor were living in Fleet St. with 5 & 7 children respectively.

The James family came from Wales. They lived in Customs House, and their 10th child was born in Gatehouse in 1858.

John James retired about 1867-70, after which the family moved to West Derby, near Liverpool. Eleanor and her family remained in Gatehouse of Fleet.

William Hume died in Brewery Cottage, High Street in 1910, this cottage being owned either by William or his son Forest Wallace Hume.
