We believe that no.60 High Street was called ELLEBANA around the 1950's. William McGaw owned the property at the time. His wife was Annie (Anabelle) Walker or Ireland, and Ellebana was her first name in reverse.

It is possible that the property was inherited / occupied by a married daughter of Margaret McTaggart, before passing to Samuel McTaggart by 1878. The valuation roll entry in 1859 could be her daughter-in-law. If that is the case then the younger Margaret McTaggart would be about 70 years old (?).
