# 72 High Street: Fleetvale



No.72 High Street

The building which now houses the Spar supermarket at the lower level and Galloway Lodge on the upper level started life as a tannery building, with the living quarters being at the street end of the building. It was no.72 and was called Fleetvale. What is now the town car park was formerly the site of tan-pits.

**1825-26 Pigot & Co. Directory** Messrs. Selkirk & Menzies were tanners in Front Street.

**1837-38 Pigot & Co. Directory** Samuel Menzies was a tanner (no address given).

**1837-38 Pigot & Co. Directory** Samuel Blyth ran a tannery business from Fleetvale Cottage.

Samuel Blythe, merchant, owned a house, shop, offices and a garden in Gatehouse. He occupied the house and shop etc whilst James B Penman, coachbuilder, occupied a workshop.

In the 1871 Census, Robert Dalziel, innkeeper, occupied the Angel Hotel at 70 High Street. The next 3 families, as listed above, appear to be in a separate building and hence we are suggesting that they may all have inhabited part of Fleetvale, 72 High Street. It is possible that some of these people were in fact living in the Angel Hotel.

In the 1891 Census, Minnie Bryson, hotelkeeper, occupied the Angel Hotel at 70 High Street. The next 2 families lived on the south side of High Street and are as listed above. The Goudie's are said to be living at "Fleetvale", but this is not the case for Mr McTaggart.

In the 1901 Census, the enumerator listed houses in the opposite direction to at least the previous 3 censuses. The 2 properties before High Street 25 were described as Laurel Bank and the property after is the Angel Hotel.

In the 1911 Census, Robert Hannah, hotelkeeper, occupied the property before the Burgess family and the next family were the Learmonth's at Laurelbank.

#### 1912-13 Girthon Valuation Roll

The representatives of postmaster John Gibson (per R A Mitchell, High St.) were proprietors of a house, offices & field where the tenant was James Campbell, postingmaster. We believe this was Fleetvale, 72 High Street, and the inference is that this might have been the post office at this time.

#### 1921-22 Girthon Valuation Roll

The representatives of late John Gibson, postmaster (per R A Mitchell) were proprietors of 2 houses, offices & field under the overall name of Fleetvale. The tenant was James Campbell, postingmaster.

#### **1930-31** Girthon Valuation Roll

The representatives of the late John Gibson (per R A Mitchell, Great Cross, Kirkcudbright) were proprietors of 2 houses, a garage and offices under the name of Fleetvale. The tenants were William & Allan Campbell, motor hirers.

#### 1940-41 Girthon Valuation Roll

W & A Campbell owned and occupied a house in Gatehouse *that was probably Fleetvale*. The field *that was probably associated with Fleetvale* was owned by Mary A Mitchell, wife of R A Mitchell, Great Cross, Kirkcudbright and the tenants were William & Allan Campbell, motor hirers.
