Rental of the Estate belonging to James Murray Esquire of Broughtoun. 1769-1772.

(Details Description of Farms; Tenants Names; Dates of Tacks;

(Commencement and Duration of Tacks; Money Rent; Interest on Dykes; other rents due incl. Loads of Beats or 3d, Days of a Man and a horse at leading of Coals or 11d, Dhearers, Days of a Man and horse at leading Hay and Corn or 11d, Days at Harrowing, Hens or 5d Capons, Chickens or 2d, Wedders or 5sh., Stones of Butter; Obligations incumbent on Heretor; Obligations incumbent on Tenent; and general observations.)

The following extracts are selected to give a comprehensive picture of the estate and its management.

PARISH OF GIRTHON

1. **Cuffington.** Mr Murray old rent £32 David McCulloch Money Rent £40.
2. **Boreland** as possess by John Brown. Two Islands in the Water of Fleet called Murrays Isles.
John Thomson.
7 Novemr 1759 25 Years Whit 1760 to Whit 1785. Money rent £75.
Heretor: To make a Fence of Pailing betwixt Boreland and Airs Sofar as the then Stone Fence was choaked up with blown Sand.
Tenent: Not to plough more than 25 Acre of Boreland. Only to take 3 Crops then to ly out 9 Years But if he dung with Marle Sleafch or Shell then may take 4 Crops and only ly out 6 Years. Bound to consume the whole ffooder on the Ground. To keep up new Slate dwelling House, any Barn Byre and Stable annually in good habitable Order and Condition and leave the Dikes Ditches and ffences in good Order at end of Tack. Irritancy if he fail in Prestations or rent remain unpaid till the 1st of March of one year due and not to be purgeable thereafter.
Observations: This Tack also included Over Nether and Mid Orchirs But John Thomson resigned the same.
3. **Orchirs.** Over, Middle and Nether.

Tenent; Assignies and Subtenents Secluded.
Observations: Only a Minute of Tack which should be extended.
4. **Airds** and little Sheep Park divided by a Stone Dike through the Sandy Brae from Boreland and by Broughtons Horse Park Dike on the North, from Syllodioch and from Clean Pork by another Dike on the West.
John Carson. 11 March 1758. 21 Yrs. Whit 1757 to Whit 1778. Money Rent £68.
Loads of Peats 30. Days of a Man and horse at leading of Coals 4. Shearers 7. Days of a Man and horse at leading corn and hay 8. Hens 6. Chickens 24.
Heretor ; to procure liberty of Moss and pay 12d for Meat for every 50 loads of .eats and to furnish Meat to all the other labourers. Tenent: Not to plough more than 22 Acres yearly. Only to take 3 Successive Crops and in other respects the same with No.2.
Tenent : Not to plough more than 22 acres yearly. Only to take 3 Successive Crops and in other respects the same with No.2 {Boreland ?} Tenent to furnish Sacks and Horse Graith for Work. Obligated to keep up a new dwelling house and Barn and the Dikes and Hedges in good condition and leave them so at end of Tack and then to remove without Warning. All the grain to be consumed by the familys dwelling on the possession to be grinded at such Miln as the heretor shall direct paying Multures and Services. Irritancy same as in No 2 and Judge Ordinary final.
5. **Meikle Barley.**
Reserving to Mr Murray all that part of the Meadows in Meikle Barley possessed by Tenents in Flilarg who are to have the Hay thereof yearly and Reserving that part of Meikle Barley marked off for the Miln Park, and including 6/- as the rents of a part of Laigh Creoch added to this possession.

Tenant: Not to plough more than a third of Corn land yearly and only to take 3 successive Crops. To pay Minrs. Stipends and all public burdens imposed or to be imposed. If Tenant require Dikes to be built Heretor to build the same and Tenant to pay...of the Expencc.

Astricted to Miln of Barley. To leave Dikes and houses in good order.

6. **Miln of Barley.**

John Thomson. 7 years Whit 1766 to Whit 1773. Money Rent £20 5s..

7. **Little Barley.**

John McClure and William Murray. 22 April 1754.

19 years Whit 1754 to Whit 1773. Money Rent £8 10s

Tenant: The same obligations as in No.5th.

8. **Barney Water** and Auchincloy.

William Boddan and Anthony Ker. 20 April 1763.

19 Yrs Whit 1763 to Whit 1782. Money Rent £30.

Tenant: Same obligations as above. But no mention of Crops nor Marsh Dikes themselves.

Observations: The Tack regulates the tenants possessions betwixt themselves.

May 1753. 19 Yrs. Whit 1753 to Whit 1772. Money Rent £10 16s. 8d. Interest on dikes 2s 3d.

Tenant: To pay Expencc of inclosing and same obligations as above.

12. **Cruffock.**

John Mcmillan. 27 March 1754. 19 Yrs. Whit 1754 to Whit 1773. Money Rent £18. Interest on dikes 17s. 8d.

Heretor: To build march dikes and other dikes as shall be agreed the Tenant procuring Masons.

Tenant; To pay... for Inclosing. To carry grindable corn to Miln of Barley if Rusco's Miln of Killearn not intitled and other obligations as above.

13. **Culreoch** with the Muir of Castramen, as it is now prop'd off in order to be divided from the Arable Ground as then possessed by John McFadzean and with a small piece of Meadow bounded on one side by the Wood of Castramen and on the other by Culreoch computed to bear about 16 Tierses of Hay yearly.

Observations: John McLure allowed to Succeed his father James at his death. Tenents grant Rect. on Tack for £8 3s. for building houses.

In Mr Murrays own possession.

22 May 1755. 19 Yrs. Whit 1755 to Whit 1774. Money Rent £10..
Observations: Receipt by Tenent for £5 5s. for building a House.
18. **Dirdon and Whitecroft** Reserving Officers Croft and. Bush Yeard Cairns of Enrigg.
Richd. Murray. 18 March 1751. 19 Yrs. Whit 1751 to Whit 1770. Money Rent £ 28. 78 Loads of Peat...24
Chickens 2 Wedders. 2 Stones of Butter.
Heretor: Betwixt and Whit 1753 to build a Sufficient Stone Dike upon Dirdon March from the Bush Burn to
Barley Burn.
Tenent: To pay... on Expenche of Dikes. Not to plough fourth nor any Lee Land which hath not layn out
at least Six Years. To plant 12 Pecks of Potatoes yearly. Thirled to Barley Miln. Obligated to Work
the Moss regularly. Not to dig or plough old Meadow Ground. Houses declared sufficient and these and
the Dikes to be kept up and left in good Order.
Observations: Wedders to be 4 Years old.
19. **Two Drumrucks Murraystoun and Cullendoch** as then possessed by Mr Murray Reserving to Mr
Murray the use and possession of the Cross house and Kitchen at Drumruck how often and how long he
shall have occasion therefore in the Summer Season yearly.

Heritor: Betwixt and Whit 1757 to build a sufficient dwelling house on Murraystoun and make it habitable of the some
dimensions and form with the Miller of Barleys house and within one year thereafter to build three Couples of a
Sufficient Barn and Tenents allowed to cut Timber for a Byre They defraying all other Expenche. To build a sufficient
stone Dike 6½ quarters high, and proportional thickness, 4½ quarters double and 2 quarters Snap from the great to the
little Water of Fleet where most useful And to build such other Dikes as the Tenents shall demand.
Tenent : Thirled to Barley Miln. To plough only ½ Arable land yearly and take three Crops But may pare burn
plough and Sow as much Moss and Muir and as they shall think fitt. To pay ...on Expences of Dikes
except the one first mentioned. To preserve Timber Keep Dikes and houses in good Condition except the
Cross house at Drumruck which Mr Murray is to uphold.
Observations: Peats (50 loads) only if desired, on or before the 1st day of May.

side of Holecroft in order to straight the Burn and to make said Ditch fencible against Cattle all at his Expenche. Thirled
to Barley Miln. To leave Ditches and Houses in good Order.
21. **Midthird Milnthird Millcroft of Enrig** Clauchan and Seggynook
Mr Geo. McMurdo.
10 Sept 1755. 31 Yrs 1756 to 1787, but 29 Yrs Clauchan 1758 to 1787. Money Rent £76 7s 9d. Interest on
Dikes £3 6s. 12 Hens, 72 Chickens.
Heretor: Tenent allowed to dig Marle or other Manure for the lands. To build sufficient Stone Fences on the
outer marches of the lands where wanting and where Ground will bear such fences and stones can be
had and where there are not good and sufficient ditches betwixt and Marts. 1756. First 2 years Rent of
Enrig and Seggynook to be allowed Tenent for building a dwelling house and offices according to a
plan to be concerted.
Tenent: Liable on Interest on Rent after the 1st of February yearly. To pay 3½ on Expenche of Outer Ditches
and Dikes. 7 on Expences of making a Fence across Enrig along the high Road leading to

Kirkcudbright and Mr Murray bound to make the fence betwixt and Whits 1757.... Not to lay more than $\frac{1}{3}$ under crop. To marle and dung all he ploughs. Only to take 4 successive crops. To ly lee 9 years. Thirled to Barley Miln. To keep up houses Dikes and Ditches..... If he dung, marle, fallow manure and prepare the lands he may plough and crop notwithstanding the Restrictions.

Observations: Hens Converted at 4d.

Tenant : Not to plough more than $\frac{1}{3}$ and 3 successive crops. Thirled to Barley Miln. To pay 8 on inclosing. To build sufficient dwelling house and support and leave the same sufficient.

23. **Enrigg Waulk Miln.** No Tack. Money rent £2 17s 1d.

24. **Flilarg** and a part of the Muir of Hillhead.

Alexr. Mclure and Patk. Heuchan.

6 March 1755. 18 Yrs. Whit 1755 to Whit 1773. Money Rent 18s 10d. Interest on Dikes 14s 6d....

Tenant: to pay 3½ for building a Dike betwixt Flilarg and Lochans and at same rate for nil other dikes. To leave houses and dikes in good order. Not to plough in any one year above $\frac{1}{4}$ besides Bear Croft and to sow no fourth crop.

Observations: This Rent before Whit 1767 was only £13 15s yearly. Robt. Marshall Entd at Whit 1767 to pay the Rent chd. so deduction must be given the factor for $\frac{1}{2}$ a year being £21 17s 6d. By both setts there is a deduction of £8 6s. 8d. yearly on acct. of Gatehouse holm which is taken off. .. to ffeuing out for the Village at Gatehouse.

Tenent: Only to have ⅓ in Crop. To take no more than 3 Crops till it lies out 6 Years. To keep and leave
Houses Dikes and Gates in good order and remove without warning. To mantoun 8 Workers at Mr Murrays
house for reasonable Board Wages.

Tenent: Prohibited to burn Muir or Heath after 1st April. To pay 7-on expence of Dikes to be built by Mr
Murray. Irritancy if he burn Heath. To leave houses and Dikes in sufficient condition and to remove
without warning.

Jas Mclauchlenie £3. Mr Murrays possession of this £6 6s.
39. **Syllodioch.** Part of Parks of Cally divided by good Stone Dikes from that part now a Horse Park and that
pert called Airds possessed by John Carson on the South and West and by a Stone Dike reaching from
Horse Park to Cuffington Park on the North and on the East.
Wm Mcmillan. 10 March 1857. 19 Yrs Whit 1757 to Whit 1776. Money Rent 830....
Tenent: Only to plough 8 Acres yearly. To take only 3 crops and not to break it up for 9 years But if he lay
Marle Sleafch or Shells may then take 4 crops and break it up at the end of 6 years taking then only 3
crops. To keep up New house and Barn built by Mr Murray and all the other houses in good order and

leave them so. To flit without warning. Thirled to any miln Mr Murray shall appoint. Irritancy if he fail or One Years Rent run to 1 of March unpaid not purgeable by payment or Consignation.

Observations : Mr Murray agrees to give the Tenent a deduction of £5 Yearly and £5 more.

Only to sow 12 Bolls Grain. To take no fourth crop. Thirled to Skyreburn Miln. To leave houses and Dikes in good order. To flitt without warning. May give up Tack at Whit 1764 or 1765 on 6 Mos. Notice. To be allowed 40sh. for a Barn if Tenant continues longer than 3 years.

Observations: Tenents in this Parish except in One Pay whole Cess, Minister Stipend, School Salary and without allowance. Assignees and Subtenants excluded.

Tenant : Thirled to Skyreburn Miln. Only to take 3 Crops off the Outfield land till it has rested a reasonable time. To keep and leave Houses Dikes and Ditches in good order and to remove without warning.
