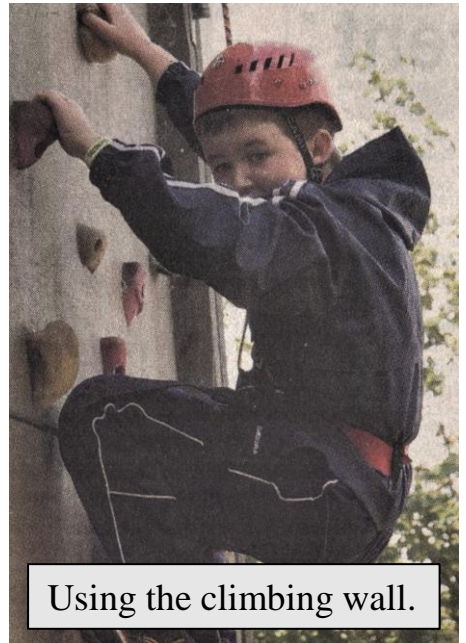


# 2007 : Scouts Centenary
