His Life

Alexander Arthur Kennedy Dallas (known as Alastair) was born at Lichterfelde, Berlin in 1898. His parents were Rev **Alexander** Kennedy Dallas (? - 1932) and Gertrude Henrietta **Marta** Muller (born 1868 Germany)

Marta, first child of Alexander and Marta was born in England in 1896 after which they lived in Berlin between 1896 and 1899 where sons Traugott and Alexander were born in 1897 and 1898.

Rev Alexander Dallas is believed to be a minister in the Church of Scotland in Berlin.

In 1901 the family were living in Duddingston, Edinburgh, with father Alexander being a teacher of languages.

Alastair jnr. attended Edinburgh College of Art.

In 1945 Alexander A K Dallas married Wylliann Weatherall, (1908 - 1997) in Dumfries.

His wife, known as Ann was also an artist. She attended Newcastle College of Art and she painted a number of pictures around Gatehouse. e.g. Mossyard Bay and Cardoness Castle.

The Dallas family lived at Old Tolboth House, Steeple Close, Kirkcudbright.

In 1965 Alastair Dallas was shown film which he believed showed a monster at Loch Ness. In 2000 an article was written after an investigation into the possibility of there being a <u>Loch Ness Monster</u> and this includes sketches which Alastair Dallas had drawn.

In 1983 Alastair's death was recorded in Kirkcudbright although some sources say that he died in Aberfeldy or Dundee.






Cairnsmore & Murrayton from Barlay






