His Life

Walter Graham Grieve was born 4th October 1872 at Kirkliston, West Lothian. Parents John Grieve (insurance agent, b.1842 Kirknewton) and Catherine Smith Graham (b.1846 Mid Calder)

In 1881 to 1901 censuses Walter, artist and illustrator, was living with his parents at St Andrews Square, Edinburgh.

1896 - 1899 Attended Royal Scottish Academy Life School, Edinburgh

About 1900 he visited the Gatehouse area and made a number of sketches and drawings - many now in the Stewartry Museum, Kirkcudbright.

1904 married Catherine Brown Law (1877 - 1962) in Edinburgh.

He is known to have illustrated several books for children in 1920s:

The Natural History Story Book by Ethel Talbot

Adventures of Don Quixote Retold for Children published 1920.

In 1927 Walter and Catherine travelled to Canada.

1937 15th March Walter died in Edinburgh, aged 54.

His grave is located at Portmoak cemetery, Scotlandwell near Kinross.








