No.9 Ann Street : (The Bay Horse)



The plot of no.9 Ann Street was first feued to Alexander Lillie, joiner in 1783. In 1787 it became the Bay Horse Inn owned by John Selkirk.

In a touching account of his early life, the celebrated artist John Faed RSA (1819-1902) recalled that Lord Kenmure, who was lodging at the Bay Horse, summoned John to meet him and told him that, as he was giving up painting, he would give John his paint box. 'No amount of language could convey the satisfaction and delight I had in carrying the box home.'

The Bay Horse later became the workshop of James McKean, joiner and then the premises of Smith and Murray, joiners.

A Mill Lade runs under The Bay Horse and there are stories that some joiners may have used this as a source of power.

Since the 1970's The Bay Horse has been an antique shop, a bed-and-breakfast business and is now a private home.

Chronology of Ownership & Occupancy

- 1783 Feu Charter of James Murray to Alexander Lillie, joiner.
- **1787** Life rent to John Selkirk Innkeeper and Jean Moffat his spouse (recorded 20/2/1788). Sometime passed to James Cowan, innkeeper.

1849 Thomas Selkirk, mariner and second son of the late Charles Selkirk, tanner in Gatehouse who was the eldest son of John Selkirk. Thomas Selkirk was the nearest lawful heir to John Selkirk, his grandfather who died in the West Indies.

- **1917** Mary Faulds McKean or Martin inherited from her mother Agnes Faulds McKean, widow of James McKean, joiner, after her death in 1917. At this time the feu was still 64 ft which covered what is now 7 & 9 Ann Street (between feu of Nathan Richmond and James Douglas' property).
- **1946** Sold by trustees of Mary Faulds McKean to William Hay.
- **1971** Part of the Bay Horse, 32 ft along street, sold 20/12/1971. This was only The Bay Horse, No.9 Ann Street.
