
## Roseville





Roseville played an important part in the artistic education of John Faed, for it was here that, as a lad, he learnt to paint miniatures on ivory. Roseville had been purchased by William Campbell (1794-1857) in 1830. As with other larger houses Roseville has a connection with the colonies. In 1833, Parliament granted £20 million in compensation to former slave owners in the British Caribbean, Mauritius and the Cape. As representative £2429.12s was awarded to William Campbell, for the ownership of 126 enslaved persons in Tobago. In February 1833 James Coltart left Gatehouse for America. A transcript of the diary of his voyage is in the Ewart Library. When he reached his relation's house in Huntsville, Alabama he noted 'Sam has a very fine house, I see none to equal it in Gatehouse if it was not Roseville.' Many years later, Roseville was inherited by William Campbell's granddaughter, Mary Rattray and her husband Arthur. Arthur was a second cousin of Thomas Rattray who raised the 45th Rattray Sikhs. Arthur and Mary had a son Arthur Rullion who became Rear Admiral Sir Arthur Rullion Rattray.
