Saw Mill House

Scott's Mill was built as a water-powered cotton mill in about 1790. In 1793 the owners issued the only trade token to be issued in Kirkcudbrightshire Click here to read about this. [then use your browser's back button to get back here]. The building only operated as a cotton spinning mill for a few years. It later became the saw mill for the Cally Estate, and part of the property was converted to house the Cally head joiner or the clerk of works.

Part of the building was used by the 4th Kirkcudbrightshire Rifle Volunteers as a headquarters and armoury from about 1860 to 1908, and was known locally as "The Barracks".



Scott's Mill was originally feued to John McWilliam, cotton manufacturer.


In the mid 1900s the building was used as an "overflow" or annex to the Murray Arms Hotel.

The main building has now been converted into flats. One of the outbuildings was converted into a house, now known as But'n'Ben, whilst Mosslade is a new house built in the old Mill grounds.
