The low-roofed house on the right is no.27, whilst the partial building on the left is no.33. The present day number on the door as seen above is 31, but it is likely that at some stage this door led to 2 separate properties no.29 and no.31. We do not know whether this was left & right or upstairs & downstairs.

Mrs Janet Ramage owned 3 houses with gardens in Girthon. One of these was 1859-60 Girthon Valuation Roll:

occupied by Grace & Mary Walker. She occupied another herself and William Dacre Alder occupied the other.

It is possible that the 3 houses were nos.29, 31 & 33 Catherine Street. Note that the property still seems to be in the name of Mrs Ramage, and not Thomas Kirkpatrick (maybe her brother) per the 1854 transfer.

Neither Janet Ramage nor William Alder are living in Girthon in 1861. The Walker family seem to have been hand loom weavers in 1851 when they lived at 33 Catherine Street. Sometime in the 1850s they seem to have moved 2 houses down the street and taken over the grocer's business at no.29.
