It appears that John & Catherine Stott ran a lodging house in 1871, and that this probably took up some if not all of what is now 48 & 52 Catherine Street, including what might have been 50 Catherine Street. The census suggests that the Stotts were lodging house keepers in 1881 and that they were superseded by the McNeils in 1891.

We have no means of knowing who might have lived in each building but we have assumed that the family running the lodging house lived at no.48, whilst the lodgers predominantly occupied no.52.

1877 Made over to James Ainslie wine merchant, Leith.

Something must have happened to this transfer as executors of Robert Hornsby sold the property 10 years later.
