# The Cut - Lochlyoch (or Hill Cottage)

"The Cut" was opened in 1823. The name of Hill Cottage changed to Lochlyoch around 1903. There is a farm in Lanarkshire called Lochlyoch, which is where the name originates.





### **◄** Chronology of Ownership & Occupancy ▶

1845

17<sup>th</sup> May: 26,120 sq. ft. of ground on the north side of the turnpike road from Gatehouse to Castle Douglas was feued by **Thomas Campbell** (1809-1861), grocer in Gatehouse, from Alexander Murray of Broughton.

Thomas Campbell married **Jane McKean** (1800-1894), sister of James McKean (1805-1879), a builder from Manchester, who built Braeside on a feu from H.G. Stewart Murray dated 26/03/1850.

The Campbells moved to Little Boreland Farm in 1856. Thomas Campbell died in 1861 after which his wife moved to High Street.

Sold for £385 by the heirs of Thomas Campbell to Margaret McCutcheon (1813-1897), Glenshalloch Farm, Minnigaff.

Lochlyoch passed to Margaret McCutcheon's nephew **Alexander McCutcheon** (1850-1898), farmer at Little Barlay (High Barlay?), later farmer at Murrayton. Margaret retained a life rent of the property.

1896 Passed to Elizabeth Muir or McCutcheon, widow of Alexander McCutcheon, farmer, Murrayton.

William Dalrymple (1835-1900) rented Lochlyoch from 1896 to 1897.

**1897-98** Entry 258 : Hill Cottage (house & offices) was owned by Margaret McCutcheon, 67 Arthur Street, Newton Stewart. And occupied by William Learmonth, teacher.

Alexander McCutcheon died at Girthon in 1898 & Margaret McCutcheon died at Penningham in 1899.

William Learmonth (1860-1938) rented Hill Cottage from 1897 to 1903. James & Catherwood are recorded as have been born in Girthon, but their birth records say were born at Fleetview, 31 Fleet Street (Anwoth).

In 1903 Alexander's widow Elizabeth (1853-1931) moved into Hill Cottage, which she owned, with her son Alexander (1886-1941) and the house was renamed **Lochlyoch**.

In 1906 Elizabeth's son, Alexander, married Mary Margaret Innes (1882-1973) and their son Alexander 'Der' (1906-1978) was born at Lochlyoch. From c.1944 until his death Der farmed at The Buchan, Glentrool with his wife Frances Mary (1894-1979). She was the daughter of Arthur Rattray (1841-1911), Roseville, Ann Street, Gatehouse.
